As we celebrate Easter season, I would like to thank you all for the outpouring of prayerful support that you have given me during the most difficult period of losing my Dad. I am sure that he is having the real Easter season with the heavenly court. I am not sad that he is gone to the Lord. I am happy for him. My mom died in 2015 and the difficult part for me is the vacuum created in me since both my parents are gone. I know that it takes time to overcome that. I am deeply moved by your prayers and support. Please continue your prayers.

Please accept my sincere gratitude for all those Masses offered and for all the flowers and cards. This time of the year doesn't allow me to write personal notes. Thank you all.

There is also another reason to write this letter. This weekend is the official weekend to announce my transfer and to introduce the new leadership team taking over. As of June 18, 2024, I will no longer be your pastor. I am assigned as pastor of St. Paul, St. Rita, St. Louis, and St. Mary by the Lake. Fr. Marco Valentini is going to be my associate pastor. Fr. Marco is from Italy and is currently serving at St. John Vianney in Brookfield. Corpus Christi Sunday (June1st and 2nd) will be my last weekend at St. Lucy.
